1	Tarangire National Park	<p>“The home of Baobabs trees and elephants to amaze your trip”</p> <p>After the morning breakfast on the slope of Kilimanjaro you will start the morning drive from Mai Kilimanjaro Home Stay to Tarangire National park. This park is Tanzania's <b>third largest national park</b> and it is characterized by the <b>amazingly large herds of elephants</b> that can be encountered in this park. The park is famous for its <b>big Baobab trees</b> which are one of the other highlights of Tarangire national park and the Tarangire River that flows all year round is the life blood of the park. A lot of animals like predators and the preys alike gather around the river where you can do excellent game viewing.</p> <p>We will enjoy a picnic lunch in the game drive under the shadow tree or inside the car and, after we travel to Mto wa Mbu/Karatu for accommodation. 2	Ngorongoro Crater	<p><b>After breakfast</b>, your safari continues to the <b>Ngorongoro Crater, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.</b></p> <p>This day we will start early in the morning, for the game drive (with a picnic lunch) inside the Ngorongoro Crater.</p> <p><b>This is the world’s largest caldera, a feature formed by the collapse of land after a volcanic eruption.</b> It is approximately 18 km in diameter and home to about 25,000 mammals. In this relatively small area you can find almost all the mammals of East Africa ranging from Grant’s and Thomson’s gazelles to mountain reedbucks in the forests on the slopes. Hyenas along with some 500-bird species can be spotted in the area. It is also possible to <b>spot the “Big Five”</b> – lion, elephant, buffalo, rhino and leopard in the few hours spent in the crater.</p> <p>Dinner and overnight as per the standard and type of accommodation option requested.</p>	Tented Lodge <a href="#">Pamoja Olea</a> or similar.

3	Bushmen's Culture.	<p>After breakfast do we head into the meadows along the shores of the mildly alkaline <b>Lake Eyasi</b> are not only home to a wide variety of wildlife including leopard, hippo, monkeys, birds, flamingos, storks and pelicans, the area is also home to the Hadzabe Bushmen's, the last tribe of huntergatherers in East Africa. <b>Some 200 to 400 Hadzabe Bushmen</b> still live much as they have for tens of thousands of years. Their simple shelters are built from grass, branches and earth. During the rainy season they still live in caves.</p> <p>During your visit to Lake Eyasi, you may visit with the Hadzabe Bushmen to witness their primitive way of life, and even accompany them on an early morning hunt.</p> <p>Extra- MASAI VILLAGE tour for (\$ 50/per group).</p> <p>Return to Mai Kilimanjaro Home Stay/Arusha to continue your next destination.</p>	<a href="#">Mai Kilimanjaro Home Stay</a>
